Thank you for your enquiry. We take great pleasure in forwarding to you the following brief outline of how the ICS qualification works:

BEGINNERS COURSE UNDERSTANDING SHIPPING

FEE R 4 250 + R 150 Subscription Fee (Incl. VAT)

The course is based on nine correspondence lessons, with a personal tutor assigned to each student. After each lesson the student is required to submit a test paper comprising of a number of multiple choice question as well as a short written paper of about 150 words.

At the end of the course students will be invited to attend a brief interview – should they be successful they will be awarded the TutorShip certificate.

FOUNDATION DIPLOMA

FEE R 12 000 + R 280 Yearly Student Subscription Fee (Incl. VAT)

The ICS Foundation Diploma comprises of two subjects: Introduction to Shipping, which is compulsory plus a Group 2 subject from the ICS PQE syllabus. (Both subjects must be passed in the same year of sitting the exams)

ADVANCED DIPLOMA COURSE

FEE R 12 000 + R 280 Yearly Student Subscription Fee (Incl. VAT)

The ICS Advanced Diploma is a combination of Shipping Business plus a Group 2 subject from the ICS PQE syllabus. If only one paper is passed then that paper is taken forward as part of the PQE process. In effect candidates sitting the Advanced Diploma only have to sit 2 examinations in their first year. This aligns with those sitting Foundation Diploma.

PROFESSIONAL QUALIFYING EXAMINATIONS

R 6 000 (Per Subject) + R 280 Yearly Student Subscription Fee (Incl. VAT)

A student has 5 years in which to complete the Professional Qualifying Examinations course.

Seven subjects must be successfully completed within the 5 years to be eligible for application for membership of the Institute of Chartered Shipbrokers. Please note: local and international vetting of candidates will decide ultimately whether the candidate will be elected as a member.

The four ,group one subjects, are compulsory. The remaining three subjects may be chosen from group two.

Second Deadline R 2125.00 register by 03 April 2018

Exemption Fee: R 2720.00 per subject

Deferment Fee: R 765.00 per subject
